### Print Reference Materials: Encyclopedias, Multivolume Works, Anthologies

<b>Encyclopedia Author named</b> (Author's name appears at the end of the article)	<p><b>Author.</b> (last name, first—period) <b>“Article Title.”</b> (period-quotation marks) <b>Title of Encyclopedia.</b> (italic -period). <b>Year</b> (period) Example:</p> <p>White, Joseph. “Ancient Egypt.” <i>World Book Encyclopedia</i>. 2006. Print.</p>
<b>Encyclopedia no author</b>	<p><b>“Article Title.”</b> (period-quotation marks) <b>Title of Encyclopedia.</b> (italic —period) <b>Year.</b> (period) Example:</p> <p><b>“Spiders.” <i>Encyclopedia Americana</i>. 2006. Print.</b></p>

**Multiple publishers:** if the title page lists two or more different publishers, include all of them, in the order given, putting a semicolon after the name of each but the last one.

**Multiple locations:** if the title page lists two or more different locations, use the first American City. Use the State when the city is not well known.

<p><b>A Multivolume work</b>—No author. When using two or more volumes, cite the total number of volumes. When using one volume, cite the volume # used.</p>	<p><b>Editor,</b> (last name, first—comma) <b>ed. Title.</b> ( italic -period—Vol. number period) <b>Place of publication:</b> (colon) <b>Publisher,</b> (comma) <b>Year.</b> (period) If the title lists more than one publisher, include them all in the order given, putting a semicolon after the name of each but the last. <b>Example for one volume:</b></p> <p>Magill, Frank., ed. <i>Dictionary of World Biography: The 20<sup>th</sup> Century, A-GI.</i> Vol. 7. **For a Magazine or Newspaper**

- Abbreviate the names of all months except May June and July
- Do not give the volume and issue numbers even if they are listed
- If an edition is listed on the masthead, add a comma after the date and specify the edition (e.g. natl., ed., late ed.)

**Electronic and Miscellaneous sources**

Note: If you cannot find some information, cite as much as you can, but **you should always question the reliability of a source if too much information is missing.** The URL is optional but ALWAYS check with your teacher.

<b>Video or Film</b>	<b>Title.</b> (italic—period) <b>Dir. First name last name.</b> (Director’s full name—period) <b>List of all major contributors such as narrator or actors.</b> (period) <b>Original Release Date.</b> (Year) <b>Distributing company,</b> (comma) <b>Year.</b> (period) <b>film.</b>  <i>It’s a Wonderful Life.</i> Dir. - Works Cited Page Checklist:**
- ✓ Double space throughout.
  - ✓ Entries are in alphabetical order by first word of the entry
  - ✓ **Do Not number entries**
  - ✓ If no author is listed, start entry with title \*\*\*Remembering to ignore *the, a, an* at the start of a title when alphabetizing.
  - ✓ First line of entry is aligned with the left margin
  - ✓ All subsequent lines are indented ½” or 5 spaces or use hanging indent format
  - ✓ Subsequent books by same author begin with 3 hyphens and a period to indicate a book by the same author
  - ✓ One inch margins
  - ✓ Typing guidelines:
    - 2 spaces after periods (.)
    - 1 space after commas (,)
    - 1 space after colons (:)
